



Goal 1 - Learn



Prepare a transportation system that can anticipate and adapt to changes in the population, economy, technology, climate, and travel behavior.

In this section, we analyze big-picture trends that will affect our transportation system—things like changes to our demographics, economy, and housing, as well as rapid and profound changes in our climate and the technologies we use. By analyzing these trends, we hope to better adapt our transportation system and prepare it for the shifting nature of and demand for transportation in our county and region.

This is no easy task during normal times, let alone in a COVID world, but we've drawn important lessons from this research that help inform the policy and project recommendations in the plan.

Review each topic to see what we learned, what the identified trends might mean for the future of transportation, and how we might address them.

Goal 2 - Assess

Moving Dutchess Forward is unlike our previous transportation plans - not only in how we present its content, but also in the scope of that content. We seek to humanize our discussion of goals and priorities, so instead of focusing on infrastructure for the sake of infrastructure, we focus on people – specifically, how our transportation system enables or prevents people from participating in the basics of life (living, working, learning, etc.). We then look at the policies and infrastructure needed to improve access, considering safety, reliability, and basic needs. We also take a close look at equity to understand how access is different for some population groups and to identify locations where we need to carefully consider the effects of our transportation decisions and investments (or the lack thereof).

In Moving Dutchess Forward, we have analyzed trends that influence our transportation system, identified barriers to access and equity, and suggested best practices to address those trends and barriers.

The remaining piece of the puzzle is funding – without that, we can't fully achieve the goals of Moving Dutchess Forward. And to figure that out, we not only need to know how much funding is needed to keep our system functioning at a basic level (such as repaving roads, repairing bridges, and running buses), but also what funding is available for transformative investments – both for discrete, location-specific projects and more holistic packages that advance our vision for the future.

In this section, we discuss how funding works, how much we expect to be available, and what investments we will prioritize. We intend for this to shape our funding priorities and guide our decisions over the next 25 years.



- We look at three levels...
 - Federal, State, & County/Local
- We look at three 'buckets' of funding
 - Highway, Transit, & Planning

Includes roads, bridges, walking, & bicycling programs



How much is available?


- Highway, Transit, & Planning
- Assumes flat funding
- Short term (2022-25)
- Long term (2025-45)
- Planning period (2022-45)





How much is needed?

- Highway
 - Roads & bridges
 - Sidewalks & rail trails
- Transit (bus focus)





Estimated Needs (\$ in millions)

Focus	Planning Period (2022-2045)
Bridges (replacing 71 bridges & maintenance)	\$314
Roads (repaving 327 miles & operations)	\$320
Transit (bus capital & operating costs)	\$490
Walking (sidewalk replacements)	\$17
Bicycling (rail trail maintenance)	\$2.9
TOTAL	\$1,144


Focus	Available Funding	Transformative Projects	Transformative Packages	Balance
Highway	\$1,176	\$132	\$1,133	\$(89)
Transit	\$247	\$31	\$313	\$(97)
Planning	\$21	n/a	\$5	\$16
TOTAL	\$1,444	\$163	\$1,451	\$(170)

Assumes outside federal funding (e.g. grants, economic stimulus programs, regional federal funds) will offset shortfalls.






